Corinne Philibert gained QTS on the CILT/British Council GTP at the Imberhorne School, where she had previously worked as a Foreign Language Assistant. She remains at Imberhorne to carry out her induction year.

- is an employment-based route where 'on-the-job' training is combined with professional duties in a school
- leads to the award of Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) on successful completion
- lasts for one year during which you will receive a salary of approximately £13,500
- is open to graduates who have the maturity and relevant experience to cope with an important teaching load at the same time as training.
